A healthy pregnancy has a direct influence on the health and development of a child. Early Head Start (EHS) programs provide services to expectant mothers, fathers, and families by providing direct services, referrals and assistance accessing community partners.

Our mission is:

- To provide quality services to expectant mothers and their unborn babies.
- To support mothers throughout pregnancy and continue support after the child is born.
- To promote healthy pregnancy

We provide:

- Education-Every pregnant
 woman has a Home Visitor
 who meets with her biweekly to
 discuss resources and
 information related to fetal
 development, alcohol, smoking,
 labor and delivery,
 breastfeeding, postpartum
 depression and infant care.
- Health and Nutrition-Home
 Visitors assist pregnant
 women in keeping up-to-date
 on prenatal and postnatal
 appointments and encourage
 healthy habits to ensure
 physical health.
- Mental Health-Each pregnant woman has access to our mental health consultant as needed.
- Family Engagement-Home
 Visitors work with the whole
 family to provide resources
 and referrals for needs that
 may arise. Parents are
 encouraged to participate in
 meetings, trainings and
 program leadership.

- Transition Services-After the baby is born we will work with each family to develop a transition plan for the child to enter our Home-Based or Center-Based program for infants and toddlers.
- Parent Cafes-Every pregnant woman will have the opportunity to meet and network with other pregnant women during monthly socialization events.
